**A TRIBUTE RESOLUTION HONORING DAVITA VANCE-COOKS**

Whereas Davita Vance Cooks, the 27th Public Printer of the United States and Director of the United States Government Publishing Office, departed Federal service on November 1, 2017.

Whereas Davita Vance Cooks was the first woman and the first African American to hold the post of Public Printer and Director of the Government Publishing Office.

Whereas Davita Vance Cooks held a series of senior management positions within the U.S. Government Publishing Office (GPO) prior to being named Chief of Staff in 2011, and Q Z K L F K F D S D F L W \ V K H F U H D W H G D Q G L P S O performance plan that resulted in significant cost savings for the agency.

Whereas under Davita Vance & R R N V . O H D G H U V K L S W K H \* 3 2 F R Q W while improving services and generating \$100 million net income while expanding the availability of government information on mobile apps, bulk data downloads, and e-books.

Whereas Davita Vance & R R N V D I W H U W U D Q V L W L R Q L Q J W K H \* centric to a content-centric organization, in 2014 persuaded Congress to recognize that focus by changing the name of the Government Printing Office to the Government Publishing Office.

Whereas Davita Vance Cooks, through her appointment of and direction to the Superintendent of Documents, and the Depository Library Council, gave Federal Depository Libraries a greater voice in the vision and future of the Federal Depository Library Program by encouraging more flexibility within the program and increasing access to digital resources and information products.

## A Tribute Resolution Honoring Davita VanceCooks

Whereas in 2017 Davita VanceCooks testified before the U.S. House of Representatives and the U.S. House Administration to advocate for modernization of the Federal Depository Library Program, including increased flexibility for regional Federal Depository Libraries, and gift and grant authority for the GPO, which will support projects and initiatives to preserve paper and digital Federal government publications.

Resolved that the American Library Association (ALA), on behalf of its members:

1. recognizes that, through her tireless leadership, peerless insight, and legendary persistence, Davita VanceCooks has affected positive change in the United States Government Publishing Office that has benefited hundreds of millions of Americans;
