Mission Statement

The Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Transgender Robattle of the American Library Association is committed to serving the information needs of the gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender professional library community, and the gay, lesbisexual, and transgender information and access needs of individuals at large. I. PURPOSE

The Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Transgender Rotabute of the American Library Association shall:

- x promote the improved quality, quantity, and acdailsty of library materials and service of particular interest or usefulness to less bisexual, gay, and almsgender people of all ages;
- x develop, promote and defend unrestricted access library users to information by or about gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender people;
- x sponsor and promote awareness of parogar and of the Stonewall Book Awards;
- x provide bibliographic services librarians, archivists, ber information professionals, and library users;
- x work toward eliminating job discrimition against gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender employees of libraries; hives, and information centers;
- x advocate revising classification hames, subject heading lists, indices, etc., in order to remove terms derogatory to the lives, activitiend contributions to culture and society of gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender people;
- x advocate within the membership and leadership LA on behalf of lesbian, bisexual, or transgender librarians, archivists, otheormation specialists, and library users;
- x support other under-represented and disataloged groups working for adequate representation and equaplportunity within ALA;
- x work with groups outside ALA interested achieving equal rights for gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender people;
- x provide opportunities for gay, sbian, bisexual, antidansgender librarians, archivists, and other information specialisattending ALA conferences troeet and socialize with one another; and

The round table shall elect a chair, a secretative asurer, five directs-at-large, and a round table councilor. The chair servet have-year term: in the first yeas chair-elect, in the second year as chair, in the third years immediate past-chair. The setary, treasurer, and directors-at-large serve two-year terms. The round table citourserves a three-paeterm. No person may serve more than two consecutive terms in times affice. If a position is vacated before the completion of the term, the executive board will esta person to serve the remainder of that term.

V. COMMITTEES

The round table shall pursue its goals primathlyough the work of its committees. A voting round table member as designated by the round table table chair each committee. Whenever possible, a committee chair will blested after having served in an apprentice capacity during the preceding year, and aftensolitation with other committee members. VII. PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Quorum

A majority of the voting members shallnestitute a quorum of the Executive Board.

VIII. AMENDING THE BYLAWS

Bylaws amendments may be proposed by the executive board or by the round table membership at a membership meeting. The bylaws may bendied by a simple majority vote on the spring ballot. The proposed amendments must have **beeo**unced not less than thirty days before the spring ballot.
